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### **MESSAGE FROM THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR**



Foothills Country Hospice opened its doors in January 2008 and have since provided expert care and bereavement support to more than 1100 residents and their loved ones. The exemplary reputation of our Hospice is a testament to our incredible team of staff and volunteers whom I would like to personally thank for their dedication, compassion and service.

We are always immensely grateful for our wonderful community support, and 2019 was another stellar year for fundraising. Our annual Hike for Hospice held in May raised \$57,000. Despite the snowy conditions, more than 400 supporters took part in the hike with their family and friends. In August, our 2<sup>nd</sup> annual Rally 4 Hospice was held, followed by our evening Gala at Spruce

Meadows. Both the rally and gala were a tremendous success, raising more than \$204,000 (net of expenses). We also benefited from several third-party fundraisers and give our heartfelt thanks to the many businesses and individuals who chose to raise funds on our behalf.

I would like to extend a very special thank you to Okotoks Sobeys and the Gilbert Family for continuing to donate food for our residents. They have graciously been doing so since we opened our doors 12 years ago and we are forever grateful.

For those who have followed the hospice over the past several years, you know that our Board of Directors has wrestled with nation-wide changes surrounding Medical Assistance in Dying (MAiD). The Board first started to consider MAiD in 2016 and voted in 2017 that the Hospice would not be a provisioning site. As things progressed both nationally and locally, the Board revisited their decision in 2018 and after a year of research and extensive consultation with stakeholders and community members, voted in May 2019 for the Hospice to become a provisioning site.

Recognizing that the implementation of this policy change would have many challenges and would stretch our staff and volunteers at the Hospice, a moratorium on the provisioning of MAiD at the Hospice was put in place until the first quarter of 2020. This allowed all involved the necessary time to ensure the policies and procedures were in place to fine tune the delicate balance of individual rights of residents with those of the employees and volunteers. In early 2020 the Hospice accommodated our first on site provisioning of MAiD.

There have long been whispers of the Hospice expanding services to additional beds, community outreach, or both. These whispers found a voice in September 2019 when the board recognized the necessity of revisiting the expansion discussion to assess the needs of palliative residents particularly in the Foothills and to embrace our desire to be a leader in innovation for rural hospices. Our board formed an Expansion Committee in September 2019 and hired an Expansion Director shortly after to spearhead our expansion efforts. Stay tuned for much more on this topic in the near future as there are many exciting happenings on this front.

As we put another year in the books, we can be proud of the work we have done. In 12 short years, we have become what we believe to be the gold standard of Hospice care. As we move forward to expand our reach and offer compassionate end-of-life care to those in the Foothills, we have much to be excited about. Foothills Country Hospice is and will remain a crown jewel of rural hospice care and a point of well-deserved pride for those who have made it what it is today.

On behalf of myself, our Board of Directors, and all our wonderful staff and volunteers, I would like to thank you for supporting our vision and the work we do at Foothills Country Hospice. We are most grateful to each and every one our supporters.

Since opening our doors in January 2008, Foothills Country Hospice has cared for 1113 residents and their loved ones.


### **Comforts of Home**

Foothills Country Hospice is located 1.5 km north of Okotoks on an eight-acre parcel of land, neighbouring golden wheat fields & nestled among forested landscapes with mountain views.

Our eight bed, 13,500 sq. ft. rural hospice home is designed to care for terminally ill adults and their loved ones in their final days or months of life. Attention is paid to physical needs, expert pain and symptom management, emotional and spiritual well-being and bereavement care as residents prepare for the final phase of their life's journey.

#### **GRIEF CONNECTIONS**

Foothills Country Hospice offers a monthly dropin group for loved ones of residents who have died at our Hospice. It is a gentle place for nonjudgmental peer support & connecting with others on similar journeys.

#### COMPASSIONATE CONVERSATIONS

Specialty trained volunteers call bereaved families once per month (or more frequently if requested) to offer a compassionate ear. If issues arise that are more in-depth, volunteers can engage our social work or spiritual care supports.

# **OUR SERVICES**

#### AROUND THE CLOCK END-OF-LIFE CARE

### **CLINICAL CARE**

Foothills Country Hospice offers 24 HR nursing care consisting of Registered Nurses (RN), Licensed Practical Nurses (LPN) and Health Care Aides (HCA). There is an RN on duty 24/7. The Medical Director and attending physicians are responsible for residents' medical care and there is a Palliative Care Specialist available on call 24/7. Our Palliative Care Specialist, attending physicians and interdisciplinary teams meet weekly to discuss resident care plans.

OFFERING SPIRITUAL DISCUSSION & CONSULTATION

### **SPIRITUAL CARE**

The Spiritual Care Director is part of our health care team and is available for spiritual discussion and consultation, or simply a supportive visit. The Spiritual Care Director can also liaise with the resident's faith community or make arrangements with local clergy and pastoral care. We also offer a Wednesday afternoon Interdenominational Spiritual Service for guests.

# WE ALL GRIEVE DIFFERENTLY

There is no one size fits all solution when it comes to grief. Everyone's circumstances are different, and each person grieves differently. At Foothills Country Hospice, we offer a monthly drop-in grief support group for families grieving loved ones. Specialty trained volunteers will also call bereaved families on a regular basis to offer a compassionate ear.

OFFERING SUPPORT TO RESIDENTS & LOVED ONES

### **SOCIAL WORK**

As part of our health care team, our Social Worker is available to provide support to residents and their loved ones. The Social Worker will meet with residents to learn about their life/family history; listen to their expressed needs and help their families determine what is most important; and offer resource information on financial concerns, legal issues, end-of-life planning and family concerns.

WEEKLY VISITS FROM OUR FOUR-LEGGED FRIENDS

### PET THERAPY

Our four-legged volunteers visit weekly, bringing warmth and comfort to residents and their families. With gentle dispositions, our pets will often seek out those who are upset, snuggling with them when possible and offering companionship to loved ones. These visits reduce stress and anxiety and bring smiles to residents' faces. Petting an animal provides comfort and encourages residents to reconnect with memories of a beloved pet.






